

Decisions, decisions—is it better to contribute to investments held within an RRSP or a TFSA?

You have limited funds and you're wondering whether it's better to put them in your Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP) or in a Tax-free Savings Plan (TFSA) eli-

gible investments.

That depends on two factors:

Generally, if your marginal tax rate is lower at the time the funds are removed from your registered plan at retirement, the RRSP option will usually produce a better result—but that is only true if your

Your marginal tax rate can be influenced by income-tested benefits including the Age Credit, Old Age Security (OAS), the Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) and the GST Credit. Because they are income-tested benefits, they are reduced or clawed-back as your income increases, ultimately disappearing entirely at an upper threshold that is different for each of the benefits. If the funds you

remove from your RRSP after age 65 increase your taxable income and result in the loss of some or all of your income-tested benefits, you will have effectively—and perhaps sub-stantially—reduced your income and increased the tax you pay. And you would have cancelled out some or all of the value of your RNSP withdrawal.



ADF research seeks to increase productivity and to address emerging issues in Saskatchewan agriculture. Projects include research into the prevention of bovine respiratory disease, the

effect of ergot-contaminated feed on bull fertility, the development of new forage varieties and the modification of swine diets to minimize greenhouse gas emissions, among others. Industry groups are providing additional funding totaling more than \$280,000, to several of the ADF projects.

Berglund opens show for Dwight Yoakam

How significant is something like this to his career?
"It's very significant," says Berglund. "I think it's all what you do with it.
"First and forms."

"First and foremost it's a pretty big platform to reach a larger audience. That's really beneficial to me. And then there's the whole online aspect of it. Kevin (Weedmark with the World-Spectator) posting those videos, my buddy JJ posted some videos and those things reach all people that weren't at the show. It's something to market.

Berglund says it's not all luck getting to open for someone like Yoakam and credits groups like Creative Saskatchewan with helping him market his name.

"It's their help with my marketing campaigns that I like to think have something to do with getting to this point. As much as it just looks like Blake is opening for Dwight Yoakam, there are a ton of people behind that happening that need to be given recognition to."

play out and how they are going to fit in your life later

is a first for me for sure," he says.
"It was awesome. It felt like a massive house concert.
Going into the show I said 'I don't feel stomach nervous I feel head nervous.'
"In the first was bit the stone Melanie (Belle Plaine)

"Right before we hit the stage Melanie (Belle Plaine) ave me a tiger's eye rock and an obsidian stone. I guess the quality of the tiger's eye is to give courage. And the black obsidian stone is to ground you. So she gave me these two stones and told me the meanings behind them and I put them in my pocket.

"You get a little bit of butterflies. The second you put

your foot out and you're walking across the stage and you're like this is what it feels like to be in front of 1,900

you're like this is what it feels like to be in front of 1,900 listening people. As soon as we were into the first chord everything settled. It's really easy to lean on Belle and Bryce for their talent and their abilities.

"My comfort zone in the performance is engaging with the crowd. As soon as we were done the first song and I started talking to the audience that's when everything settled in and it felt really homey. The time flew by. It was great.

"We've been on the road for 10 years and when you're given an opportunity like this. that's what I'm working

given an opportunity like this, that's what I'm working towards. I told myself I deserve this, I deserve to be on that stage and perform like I deserve to be on that stage.
"It was just sort of this moment of confidence. These

are the dreams, these are the goals and they are coming in. We've worked hard for them and we've set our sights

in. We ve worked hard for them and we ve set our sights on them, so when they come, let's just admit that we deserve to be here. It felt really natural.

"The biggest reward was standing outside the venue at the end of the show and handing the flyers out and just expecting to be like 'have a good night, here's a flyer.' I didn't expect a response back to me when passing

those flyers out and it really was people giving me 10 seconds of their time to extend how much they appreciated the show. That means everything to me."

Berglund says opening for someone light Yoakam sim-

ply adds a bit of extra momentum to what he is already

"Hopefully a few festivals can come of it. It's a nice rioperuny a rew restroars can come or it. It's a nice opportunity. You can put it on the resume. The right person may read it and hopefully it will resonate with them. Hopefully it will help with the booking and it will be nice to see how those contacts come into play down

"It's momentum. We had a really good 2016 . . . And for something like this to come in at the beginning of 2017 is just pulling back on that slingshot for a little more for momentum."

Berglund says after the concert he found renewed ex-

Berglund says after the concert he found renewed excitement in booking shows for 2017.

"We were doing really well but it just gave us even more momentum to add to what we gained over 2016," he says. "I have a record coming out this year so it adds to the buzz leading into a record release. It all just part of that snowball effect."

Berglund says he choice was and will continue to be a


Berglund says he choice was and will continue to be a full time musician for the rest of his life.


