Harvest of Hope

Local project for Canadian Foodgrains Bank

A group of young local farmers are going to be taking some time away from their own farming operations this growing season to help the people who need it

The farmers will be growing wheat and oats for the Canadian Foodgrains Bank, which supplies Canadian food aid to projects in developing countries.

Nicholas Heide is one of the

farmers who is involved in the

"We were talking about it in November, thinking it would be a good thing to do, but we didn't have any land for it.

"It was a few of us farmers who started talking about it. There's Derek Smart, Dale Smart, Ron Dietrich, Cory Enns, Kevin Whelpton, Jared Hebert, Ernest Rushton, and my little brother Joseph Heide Mo and Derek base. seph Heide. Me and Derek have talked about it lots, and last fall we got a few others talking about

it.

"My dad used to do one on our
"Mosomin about

10 years ago.
"I'm farming now, and I thought I wanted to do that someday, but I didn't think it would be this quick.

Heide and many of the others involved are very young and just

getting started on their farming careers. Heide started helping on his dad's farm when he was just a boy, but has been farming on his own only since 2010.

"I've just been getting going farming—I thought maybe this year there won't be a flood," he says with a laugh.

says with a laugh.
Why do a group of young farmers want to put the effort into a
Foodgrains Bank growing project
when they are still building their own operations?

"It sounds like a big project, but for the amount of time it takes out of my day, in the middle of summer, to do 275 more acres, it's not that hard to do and it helps a lot of people. It's a way to do some good."

Part of the reason the project is going ahead this year is that some land came available to rent next to Highway 8 between Moosomin and Rocanville—a highly visible location.

"Guy Shepherd found it," Heide explains. "It used to be some of my dad's old land. A guy from Alberta owns it now, so

we're renting it."

The crops will be planted on two quarters of land. The farmers to seed 145 acres of wheat, and 130 acres of oats.

The farmers believe their growing project will make a big differ-

ence in a lot of lives. If all goes well, the 275 acres could produce \$80,000 of rev-enue, which will be matched four to one by the federal government.

Heide says the plan is to make the growing project an annual

"We want to try and keep

something going for many years to come now," he says.

The local committee is in the

The local committee is in the early planning stages of the growing project.
"We've got a letter we'll be sending out to local business and implement dealers," Heide says. "We need everything from crop inputs to labor to cash to make this work."
"There may be a public event

There may be a public event There may be a public event tied into the growing project. "We would like to do a harvest barbecue, but we haven't got to those details yet," says Heide. "It would be cool to have a lot of farmers come in and take it off in one day."

The weather may be a concern for the project. "I just hope for the best," says Heide. "It's look-ing like it's going to be wet, but all we can do is hope."

The one thing Heide isn't wor-ried about is the people to help with the project. "I don't think it'll be hard to get volunteers," he says. "We've got the farmers on the committee who are willing to put a lot of work into it, and everyone we've talked to about it has thought it's a great idea, so I'm sure there will be lots of sup-

port.
"We've been getting a good reaction. People ask lots of questions, and they're saying they

will support it. It's been really

Jim Cornelius is executive director of the Canadian Foodgrains Bank. He said in an interview Friday that projects like Moosomin's growing project are the lifeblood

of the organization.
"These projects are vital to the
Foodgrains Bank," he said. "Almost half of donations come in niost nair of donations come in via these type of projects, and the visibility they provide for us in communities contributes to the other donations. They are essen-tial to our work."

The Foodgrains Bank has more than 200 growing projects across Canada, and there will be six or seven new projects this year.
"They're usually someone who

has seen it or was involved in it somewhere else," says Cornelius. "They'll often be in touch with our regional co-ordinator. Their job is to provide encourage-ment and support for these lo-cal groups. The initiative usually comes from one or two people who say 'we could do this in our community.'"

More people are taking that at-titude, as over the last five years donations to the Foodgrains Bank



"Our experience is that it's people that recognize that they've been unusually blessed," says Cornelius. "They've had a chance to grow up in a country where there's peace and opportunity and a sta-

ble government, and they recognize how fortunate they are.

"They also recognize they have a responsibility to others and an ability to

impact other people's lives.

"They decide they can do something to help someone else."

Cornelius says he is continually in-

spired by the volunteers who run the lo-cal growing projects.

"Sometimes running an organization like this, problems can arise, and you can

get discouraged. If that happens to me, I just go out and meet with some of these groups. They're so committed, they're trying to do what they can to help, it just

On Saskatchewan highways: Moose on the loose can wreak havoc

"It happened so fast. You're on top

of them before you even know it."

Last December, Harvey Presber was driving into town to see a hockey game from his home outside Naicam

Naicam.

About three miles from his destination, traveling at roughly 90 kilometers per hour, he hit a moose.

The massive animal smashed in his windshield, took out his grill and headlights, flipped over the roof, and mangled the front and back doors on the driver's side in the process. His granted a complete write of

or univer's side in the process. His car was a complete write-off.

On the bright side, he did walk away with a souvenir.

"I felt something on my lap," Presber said. "It was a piece of broken antler."

He's lucky to be alive, but his close encounter was far from unique. It seems everyone knows someone who knows someone who has had a near miss with a moose —or worse.

This is an increasingly common

story in parts of the province that never used to see moose at all. In November and December of 2012 alone, SGI reports there were 98 col-

lision claims involving moose, costing \$263,000.

Moose are making themselves known in other ways too—specifical-

ly with crop damage.

They now regularly find their way into farmers' fields—causing fence damage along the way—and have

developed a taste for canola, flax, and field peas.

According to Ryan Brook at the niversity of Saskatchewan, this University of Saskatchewan, this type of moose activity so far south in the province is a very recent develop-

"Historically, moose were considered a boreal forest species, so really they weren't commonly seen out on the prairie or farm land," he said. "But in the last 15 years, there's been a real dramatic increase in the number of moose in farmland areas.

So, why are we seeing so many moose on the loose?

"It could be related to climate change," Brook said. "Certainly, 15 years ago, Saskatchewan was a lot drier than it is now. We're seeing a kind of wet swing in the last five years, which is going to help with shrubs and wetlands, which moose feed in."

Brook also pointed out that hunt-ing habits have changed in recent decades.

Thousands expected at Old **Tyme Harvest for Hunger**

Langenburg harvest bee will use antique threshing machines

Harvest on the farm generally means hard, seemingly endless work.

But on Aug. 24, one harvest will be unlike anything seen for decades, not only for its work—specifically how seen for decades, not only for its work—specifically how the work will be completed—but for the amount of fun

it's expected to be.

This year will host the inaugural Olde Tyme Harvest This year will host the inaugural Olde Tyme Harvest for Hunger near Langenburg, a fundraising event being promoted as "the world's largest harvest bee using antique threshing machines." The project will see 140 acres of winter wheat grown and reaped for the benefit of the Canadian Foodgrains Bank. Organizers hope to attract between 2,500 and 5,000 people to the late-August event. "There have been numerous foodgrains bank projects in the region, but not in this line," said Old Tyme Harvest for Hunger spokesperson Warren Kaeding. "Those are generally a cooperative with a bunch of local producers working together. None of them that I know of are really

working together. None of them that I know of are really this big of an extravaganza. We're terming it an olde tyme threshing festival.

Kaeding said they are hoping to garner 60 bushels of winter wheat an acre off of the 140 acre plot. Most of the produce will be harvested by antique threshing machines and steam-powered engines owned by operators from Manitoba, Saskatchewan and, possibly, a few from the United States. A handful of threshers will come from Ken Mack, a Langenburg-area farmer who has hosted thresh-

ing demonstrations in the past.

Some of the wheat will be brought in by conventional

combines as a demonstration of the products being sold by sponsors of the event. All told, Kaeding expects 8,400 bushels of wheat will be harvested and thousands of dollars will be raised for the Canadian Foodgrains Bank. Much of this will be matched by the Canadian Government through the Canadian International Development Agency, which provides up to \$25 million in matching funds to help with the bank's pro-

gramming.
"We would also like to motivate local farmers to donate

to Foodgrains on their own at their respective elevators,"

Kaeding said.
There's more to the Olde Tyme Harvest for Hunger than a massive threshing demonstration, however. There will also be demonstrations on binding and seeding.
"We may even try to get a horse-drawn seeder to show how things were planted back then," Kaeding said.

The day will include other attractions, as well. Attenders the state of the day will include other attractions, as well.

The day will include other attractions, as well. Attendees can see vintage farm equipment - including steam powered machinery - a trade show, food booths, musical entertainment and shows containing Ukrainian and Square dancers. Organizers are also growing and constructing a corn maze for children to lose themselves in. "And we're not going to charge a fee to get in. We're hoping people will be open to donating when we pass around a grain bag to collect money," said Kaeding, who added that funds are also being raised through sponsorship packages being sold for \$250 per acre.

Kaeding expects the day will require up to 200 volunteers drawn from communities in a 30-mile radius of Langenburg.

The Canadian Foodgrains Bank – a Christian organization made up of 15 churches and church-based agencies – is marking its 30th year of fighting hunger around the world. The bank accepts grain and money to provide assistance to people with immediate food needs; improve food security to third-world communities by promoting effective agricultural techniques and livelihoods; and promote proper nutrition to people living in communities promote proper nutrition to people living in communities

The bank also lobbies government for policies that help eliminate world hunger and promotes the issue among Canadian residents.

The Canadian Foodgrains Bank has worked on proje in Mexico, Central America, Brazil, Africa, the Middle East and Asia. Since its inception in 1983, the organiza-tion has distributed more than 1.1 million tonnes of food

to hungry people throughout the world.

Funds to help recruit docs

putting extra resources into attracting recently graduated physicians to rural Saskatchewan communities and improving patients' access to physician services.

The Rural Physician Incentive Program will provide \$120,000 in funding over five years to recent medical graduates who establish practice in rural communities of 10,000 or less.
"Recruiting doctors to rural ar-

eas and keeping them once they're here is a huge priority for our gov-ernment," Premier Brad Wall said. "We've had some really solid success, increasing Saskatchewan's overall physician supply, but there are challenges in rural communities. This program will help improve patient access to physician services in rural areas

"I've heard firsthand from many rural residents that physician ser-vices are a serious concern," Rural and Remote Health Minister Randy Weekes said. "This is another way that we're working to keep our commitment to address health care needs in smaller communities."

Eligible physicians will receive a payment at the end of each year of practice, with payments gradually increasing over the five-year period. Wall announced the new program at the Saskatchewan Association of Rural Municipalities annual convention in Saskatoon.

"We are very pleased the provincial government has developed a

program aimed specifically at increasing the number of physicians in rural Saskatchewan," SARM President Dave Marit said. "Municipalities work very hard to recruit and retain their local doctors, and we be-

retain their local doctors, and we be-lieve this new program will provide a strong incentive for medical gradu-ates to consider rural practice." Newly graduated doctors typi-cally finish studies with a large debt load due to their many years of edu-cation. The incentive is designed to help ease that financial burden. "The incentives in this program will benefit patients by addressing the critical shortage of family physicians in rural Saskatchewan," Saskatchewan Medical Association President Dr.





Report slams Manitoba flood forecast system

A new report says the Manitoba government relied on outdated technology and inexperienced forecasters as it faced report the control of the c record flooding in 2011.

The independent review, led by civil engineer David Farlinger, says the province used an outdated forecast model that did not adequately take rainfall into ac-

The review also says the data system was so old, forecasters were doing some work by hand.

The report says overall, the province responded well to the flood once it happened, but the forecasting was lacking.

The province's chief forecaster had re-

tired and his replacements had between six months and three years of experience. Emergency Measures Minister Steve Ashton says the government is already utting new equipment in place and is

hiring more staff.

Ashton says some of the other recommendations are more expensive and will have to be considered.

Those include a call for an extra outlet

on Lake Manitoba and a new reservoir or diversion channel along the Assiniboine. At its peak, the 2011 flood forced 7,100 people from their homes—about two thousand aboriginals have not returned almost two years later.



Eastgate Business Park:

Earthwork starts for new development

The snow and topsoil have been scraped away, semi loads of clay are being piled onto the frozen ground, and excavators are

spreading and grading the clay.

After 30,000 cubic yards of clay are brought in to alter the landscape, what has been a farm field for 130 years will become Moosomin's newest development—East-gate Business Park.

The earthwork going on now is to prepare the site of the first business to be built

in the development, Celebration Ford.
Work will start on the building this May,
and a year from now the new 25,000-squarefoot dealership should be open, directly

west of Borderland Co-op.
Tyler Thorn of Celebration Ford says he had his sights set on the property at the cor-ner of the Trans-Canada Highway and East Access Road.

"Because of the visibility and the traffic, this is where we wanted to be," he said. "We knew we wanted to be on the highway, and we looked at other locations, but we kept coming back to this one." Celebration needs six acres for its new

dealership, but purchased the entire 33-acre parcel of land in order to move ahead with the project, with the plan of subdividing the parcel and selling the rest.



Government holds line on education property tax

Premier Brad Wall an-nounced that the govern-ment will hold the line on education property tax in

The overall value of property in Saskatchewan has increased 67 per cent over the past four years, from \$58 billion in 2009 to \$97 billion in 2013, thanks to Saskatchewan's strong and

growing economy.

Wall said while that's good news for property owners, it could have meant

significant property tax increases if the government had left the education prop-

erty tax rates unchanged.

"A few weeks ago, Government Relations Minister Jim Reiter said that our government would take a close look at the impact of close look at the impact of this huge increase in prop-erty values on property tax-es," Wall said. "Today, I am pleased to announce that despite some significant pressures on our provincial budget, we will hold the line on education property

taxes in 2013."
Wall said that means education tax rates will be reduced significantly in this week's provincial budget to keep the overall impact on property taxes revenue-neutral in terms of re-as-

"That means some proper-ty owners will still see their taxes go up because their assessment went up more than average, while others will see their property taxes

go down," Wall said. "But overall, we are holding the line on education property tax mill rates

Wall said that with a growing population and increasing school enroll-ments, the government may have to look at adjusting the education property tax in the years ahead.

"When our government

took office, the education property tax funded about 60 per cent of K-12 school costs with the remainder being funded by the government of Saskatchewan," Wall said. "In 2009, our government delivered the largest education property tax cut in Saskatchewan history. As a result, education taxes now fund about

35 per cent of K-12 school costs. "We

"We will want to sit down with SUMA, SARM and SSBA and hear from Saskatchewan people in advance of next year's budget on how we go forward in terms of the need for financial support for increasing enrollment and education infrastructure demands.

He says he is looking for-ward to moving his busi-ness into a building with

room to grow.
"In terms of building space, we're going from 15,000 square feet under three roofs to about 25,000 square feet all under one roof, which will be a big improvement," says Tyler.

"In terms of lot space, we're now working on 1.5 to two acres, and we'll have six acres available at the new site. We'll have more room for staff parking, we'll have room for more inven-tory, we'll have room for more customers.

"Just the parking alone will be a big improvement," he said.

"Right now parking is a big problem, by 8:15 a.m. there isn't a parking spot anywhere around here."

The new location will give the business room to

grow.
"Between the body shop and the service shop, the new shop will be double the capacity," says Thorn. "As long as we can staff

it, we should be able to

grow into it."

What are the biggest challenges for a building project this size?

"There are so many people involved," says Tyler.
"Trying to gather all that information together into one, when everyone has a different opinion on the right way to do it, trying to decipher the information, just co-ordinating all that just co-ordinating all that information into one, it's a

information into one, it's a big job."
"It takes a lot of time," adds Bill. "We had three meetings with telephone and technology people yesterday looking at networking and phones. That took eight hours."
There have been some inquiries from people internatives.

ested in building in the new

development.
"We've been getting a few inquiries, and we think that will only increase once we get going. We've had one person in the development business talk to us, we have had lots of people talking about it."

Celebration should be moving into the new development within a year.

"We've been using March 1, 2014 as our move-in date," says Tyler. "We're still using that as our target date. I think all this snow is going to slow it down a bit,

but that's still our target."
Under a development agreement with the town of Moosomin, the Thorns will build Celebration Drive and will install water and sewer on the new development, and the infrastructure will become the town's property

once it is completed.

This is the first time the town has had such an agreement, and both sides say they are happy with it.
"The town has commit-

ted to running the services to the property line, and we were really pleased with the town's infrastructure commitment," says Tyler. "They've been very good to work with."

Mayor Larry Tomlinson says the agreement works well from the town's per-

spective as well. "I think it will work well," says Tomlinson. "It takes us out of the land business, so

it makes it easier for us."
While building a new

dealership and an entire development complete with water and sewer and roads, the Thorns are also looking to sell their current properties along Broadway Avenue. One property has been sold already.

Bill says he's always

Moose a growing danger on Saskatchewan highways

"T talked to a producer not too long ago who said, on the farm that he and (his the farm that he and (his family) live on, there used to be 91 people by the end of the 1800s. And all of those people would have had large families—and a let of people with runs.

had large families—and a lot of people with guns.

"So there are a lot of factors at play. Habitat is changing. And moose seem to be adapting—it certainly shocked me to learn that moose are eating field peas, canola, and flax. That's quite a unique situation in and of itself." tion in and of itself."

Brook and his colleagues

at the U of S have recently started a study to track the moose to better understand their patterns of movement.

To do this, they're outfitting the behemoth beasts with special collars that contain very sophisticated transmitters, capable of sending text messages to Brook and he fellow re-

searchers. "Each collar has a satellite phone built into it, and three times a day it phones us and gives us our data," Brook said. "This technology is unbelievable. From the satellite collars, we're also going to get very de-tailed information on how, when, and why moose are crossing roads and high-ways. It's a game changer for us. These collars are

giving us one location every hour, 24-hours a day, seven days a week for two full years."

In the end, the study will give the researchers a better sense of how to manage the influx of moose, and what can be done to keep them off Saskatchewan's

roads and highways. "We'll have to have good information before we start talking about what we're going to do about it," Brook said. Some of that could include better education of drivers. Brook said, at the moment, too many people see moose crossing signs with speed reductions, but don't bother slowing down.

"And there are more ag

gressive interventions gressive interventions to keep moose away from roads and highways—fenc-ing, potential use of salt or mineral block," he said. "One of the things that's used a lot on roads is salt, and salt is clearly attractive

—especially for moose. They get down on their knees, and basically start licking the roads to get the salt. So putting out mineral may actually help deflect interest in roads. I think if we identify the risk factors, we can start to target our efforts in the highest risk areas, and in the ways that are most likely to have an

actual benefit. "We don't want anybody getting into any ac-
