

Enbridge to file for Line 3 replacement

Enbridge held an open house in Mary-field Thursday to answer questions about its Line 3 replacement project.
Line 3 has been transporting Canadian

crude to the United States for almost 50

years.
Enbridge announced plans last year to replace portions of the pipeline. The plan has changed since last year. Enbridge now intends to replace the pipeline across the Prairies from Hardisty, Alberta to the U.S. border—a \$7.5 billion undertaking that would be the largest project in Enbridged, bitchory.

Enbridge's history.

Some landowners at the meeting ex-Some landowners at the meeting expressed concern over Enbridge's plan to install a new pipeline and decommission the current Line 3, leaving the current pipe in the ground once it has been decommissioned and capped.

The company says the decommissioning is safe, but some landowners are worried about deterioration of the pipeline in future decades.

future decades.

"We have about six pipes going across a fair bit of our farm," said Darryl John-

"Their plan is to disconnect the old pipe, put a new replacement in beside it, and we don't want that old pipe in the ground. I'd like to see it removed completely, but they're telling us it'll be fine to leave it there. I'm a third generation farmer, and I'm concerned, down the road, when my next generation comes along, if there could be liability issues with this stuff and where does that leave

with this stuff and where does that leave the next generation."

"I don't think I'm going to see a prob-lem with it, I think their processes are reasonable, but I'm not really excited about the way they're going about it. And I would say that most of the people I've been in touch with are voicing simi-lar concerns." said Johnson.

"CAEPLA (Canadian Association of
Energy and Pipeline Landowners Associations) is not against pipelines, we're just against the way they put them in," said Wayne DeRoo of Fairlight. "We're not disagreeing with putting the pipe in,

we just want the junk that they left there to be removed. I'm just saying we should be respected when they come in to do projects "

projects."
"They say they're going to cap it and fill it with an inert gas," said DeRoo. "So how are we going to know whether it is actually working properly without that line corroding over time? I don't expect it to happen in my lifetime, but if my son or his family are driving over that with a sprayer at 15 miles an hour, and the front wheel his that collapsed nine they're sprayer at 15 miles an hour, and the front wheel hits that collapsed pipe, they're going to end up through the front window. It's a safety thing.

"If you're done with it, clean it up," said DeRoos. "That's only respectful."

According to Enbridge they have three reasons for leaving the pipeline in place.

"1. Removing pipelines entails major construction activities and disturbance to farmlands, neighbourhoods, roadways,

wetlands, and green spaces, which we strive to avoid whenever possible. Since the decommissioned pipeline will not be removed, there will be no visible above ground changes along the right-of-way. Subject to ordinary restrictions, farming and agricultural related activities can continue on the pipeline right-of-way.

"2. Avoiding the use of heavy equipment needed to excavate and remove the ment needed to excavate and remove the buried pipeline reduces risk to maintain-ing safe pipeline operation of other lines that share the right-of-way. 3. Finally, leaving a pipeline in place reduces the risk of soil stability issues

that could compromise the integrity of operating pipelines that share the right-

What does this mean for landowners and communities?

"Our decommissioning process, ongo-ing monitoring and federal oversight are

specifically designed to protect landownspecifically designed to protect landown-ers from incurring liabilities resulting from the pipe that is left in place once operation ceases. For example, in the un-likely event of pipeline related soil con-tamination, or other issue in the future, Enbridge will work with landowners and communities on an individual basis to re-spond and remediate in accordance with

applicable federal and provincial envi-ronmental regulations."

According to Enbridge, "We have a vested interest in ensuring that any de-commissioned pipeline does not cause subsidence issues because these issues subsidence issues because these issues could compromise the integrity of the other pipelines that share the right-of-way. To prevent this from occurring we will continue to monitor and protect against corrosion by maintaining cathodprotection. Enbridge is responsible for s pipelines, whether or not those pipe-

its pipelines, whether or not those pipe-lines are actively operating, as well as the costs related to ongoing maintenance."
"The biggest concern with leaving the decommissioned pipeline in the ground is getting the pipeline clean," said Dan O'Neill with Enbridge. "We are coming up with a plan to clean the pipeline, so sending a series of brushes and squeegies through mushed by nitrogen Right now

sending a series of brushes and squeegies through, pushed by nitrogen. Right now they're trying to determine what the best solution is, like maybe a water solution with a detergent in it to clean the line." "One of the other things I'm concerned about is biosecurity," said Johnson. They're bringing equipment in from different areas, and nowadays there are a lot of things in agriculture that are pretty intensified. There are issues with clubroot and some noxious weeds that come from other areas that are spreading."

"I've had some noxious weeds spread on one of my pieces of land about 10 years ago and they kind of danced around the subject," said Johnson. "They didn't outright say that it wasn't their fault, but they didn't come clean it up either, so I had to try to get the land back in shape. I had 13 acres that I took out of production for about 10 years, because of that biosecurity."

Gabrielle and Gage Fouillard

their lives. In fact, the cousins only started rodeo about two years ago. Despite that, they found themselves at the Na-tional High School Rodeo Finals in Rock Springs, Wyoming from July 13-19.

The Finals showcase the best young rodeo contestants from 45 different states and provinces, and Australia. Over 1,500 cowboys and cowgirls were compet-

"When I started rodeo, I never ever would have dreamt that I

would have made it to Nationals," says Gage.

The girls got involved in rodeo about two years ago when another cousin had some interest in

"My cousin was into rodeo a little bit, and Gab wanted to try it, so she and I decided we'd do it together," explains Gage. She says her and Gabrielle never planned to take rodeo too far, but for the past two year, they've competed at the Canadian High School Rodeo Finals, and this

year, Gabrielle was named ro-deo queen for the Manitoba High School Rodeo Association

"We thought we'd just go to the close rodeos, but my horse the close rodeos, but my horse started doing really good, and Gab's horse started doing really good, and we ended up competing for the top spots," Gage says. Both girls say they learned rodeo on the go.

For Gage, she and her horse Annie learned how to barrel race by entering a rodeo and just giv.

"I went to a rodeo and just decided to try it. I started practicing after that a lot by myself, just going around the barrels, and watching what the other girls were doing," says Gage.

O'Neill said that Enbridge takes biosecurity

"We get a lot of people that are happy and impressed that we have a biosecurity program," said O'Neil. "It's quite new for use the whole reseen that us, the whole reason that we have a whole biosecu-rity plan is because of the new concerns that land-owners are coming up to us with across the province now. Clubroot is a big one, so a lot of people are happy we have a plan and oth-ers would like to see us do more. We're discussing with them and seeing where we can do the best job we can."

"Biosecurity is something to work on with people like Dr. Stephen Strelkov at the University of Alberta to try to figure out what the best approach to sampling is, we work with provincial governments to see what they're doing, consult with them and consult with land owners to try to find the "Biosecurity is something

them and consult with land owners to try to find the best approach and try to make something that's reasonable for everybody."

"A lot of the time we take notes when we're talking to people," said O'Neill. "We're meeting with the landowners and taking notes on their concerns, both overall and in regards to their specific property. to their specific property, and that goes in to what we call our Consultation Log, which is part of our NEB application."

That's the third big thing with the Owners' Association is two would like sociation, is we would like to see it as a lease agreement because then down the road, say for my son, if he had a lease along that pipe-line it would be more of an asset. I think that if there's a liability issue then En-bridge doesn't want to own or lease the land because or lease the land because then they're responsible for the cleanup. My opinion is that they could evaporate like big companies do nowadays, then who's on the hook for the mess? That stuff's in my ground."

"The first pipe was put in in 1950 and at that time they said that its usable lifespan was 30 years. It's now 2014 and that makes me wonder what the real integrity of the pipeline is. I'm not go-ing to know because I'm not allowed near it," said John-

son.
"One of my other concerns, is that as farming evolves, we get bigger equipment and more in-tensified practices on the land. There has been mention in other circles, not by Enbridge specifically, but they may limit what kind of equipment you can pass over their line with," continued Johnson.

"I'm sure we'll work things out," said DeRoo. "I think Enbridge has a pretty good understanding that they need to look after landowners and keep the pub-lic happy and content, and

that's the first thing we're looking for, to keep our family and our farms viable. Safety is number one."

The Maryfield open house is one of several Enbridge is holding in communities along the route before submitting a regulatory application, which it plans to do by the end of 2014. "We were originally planning to replace seven segments in different areas, some longer, some shorter," said O'Neill. "At that time we were working with our we were working with our customers who ship oil on the line, and we came to an agreement with them, that they'd like to see us restore the capacity of the line back to what it originally was, and replace the entire line. That's where we're at now and that's why there's been

a bit of a delay in the appli-

cation."
"We did a field study that
was completed in May,"
said Enbridge engineer
Martin Stribrny. "And we're
starting the detailed design
now. We're still negotiating
the contact, it should all be
not in place within a month cation. put in place within a month

or so. The detailed design is supposed to take until the middle of next year some-time, and then we would be doing the final drawings. There are three construction seasons, summer of 2016, winter, and summer of 2017."

Enbridge officials say that the company takes leak de-

the company takes leak tection very seriously.

"Along the pipeline there are a number of sensors that measure things like flow, pressure, temperature, density, and viscosity. If that informatical tection is the companion of th tion changes, it gets sent up to computers in Edmonton about every five seconds to the operator. We have 32 lines running out of the control centre and almost as many operators on shift 24 hours of the day, and a trained leak detector with them," said leak detector

them," said leak detector Ron Threlfal.
"If there are any differ-ences between what the model thinks should be go-ing on and what the readings say, it causes a discrepancy. We monitor those and if it becomes significant we generate an alarm."

St. Lazare-McAuley area:

Manitoba wants \$4 billion mine

The Manitoba government would like to see a \$4 billion potash mine developed in the Russell-St. Lazare-McAuley area.

McAuley area.

Plans for a potash mine in western Manitoba have been complicated over the years by the fact that
ownership of mineral rights has
been widespread.

But in the last year, the Potash

Corporation of Manitoba—a Crown corporation—has assembled the mineral rights in the RMs of Russell and Ellice, from the Assiniboine River to the Saskatchewan border.

River to the Saskatchewan border.
"For the first time since potash
exploration started in Manitoba in
1959, the entire resource is now under the control of one entity," said
Chris Beaumont-Smith, acting manager of the province's minerals policy. "We have no interest in being a
potash miner. We are just looking to
reate the opportunity."

Now the Crown corporation is sending letters to potash producers, looking for interest in developing the deposit. Letters will go to major potash producers including Agrium, Mosaic and PotashCorp and will ask for expressions of interest in developing a \$3-billion to \$4-billion mine somewhere in the Russell-McAuley area.

The potash belt that runs across Saskatchewan extends into western Manitoba.

More than one billion tonnes of potash lie on the Manitoba side, 800-1000 metres below ground in the 2,247-square-kilometre Russell-McAuley deposit, which the province claims is comparable in quality and mining conditions to similar deposits across the Saskatchewan border, where Agrium, Mosaic and Potash Corp. Over a 40-year lifespan, the mine could yield two million tonnes of potash per year sugar lifespan, to 600 libes and create a contraction. of potash per year, sustain close to 600 jobs and create a \$60-million annual payroll—in addition to generating \$2 billion worth of mining royalty revenues for the province over the life of the mine

over the life of the mine.

Riding Mountain MLA Leanne Rowat said she hopes something will come of the government's letters, but she's not holding her breath.

"I grew up in Russell, and when I was in high school I remember Howard Pawley going on and on about pot-

ash and what it was going to do for Manitoba, so we've heard this before," said Rowat, whose riding includes St.

"Instead we saw Saskatchewan take the lead. I'm cauinstead we saw Saskatchewan take the lead. I in cau-tiosly optimistic, but I'm very concerned the province is talking about this when there's so much hurt with the flood. There are people who haven't been paid for dam-age in the 2011 flood and who have not had a crop in the ground for three years. We can't get them to come to the table on that, and now the province is talking potash. I would be very concerned if this NDP government is playing games when we have people hurting out here very seriously. I truly hope he's not playing games."

She said that, while the NDP government is touting

the potash mine, the province has become less attractive for mining

investment in recent years.

"Every year there's a barometer that comes out that looks at how interested mining companies are in investing in different jurisdictions. Seven years ago, Manitoba was number one, and right now we're number 26."

Rowat said she hopes there's something behind the government's announcement.

ment's announcement.
"I would like to see the details,"
she said. "It would be a great opportunity for the people of this
province, they damn well better
have some concrete information to
back this up. I know there is a siginficant amount of potash along the
border, but Saskatchewan is movprovinced while Merichen is at the

border, but Saskatchewan is moving ahead, while Manitoba is at the letters of interest stage, based on a company giving up their interest. "They better not be spreading false hope. I've seen them do this before. A lot of people are hurting in my area and I' hope they're not doing this because they're getting a lot of bad publicity because of they flood."

She said Manitoba's government could learn a lot from Saskatchewan about attracting and growing business.

She said Manitoba's government could learn a lot from Saskatchewan about attracting and growing business.
"In the oil industry, Saskatchewan is leaps and bounds ahead of our province, and looking at the minerals report, every other jurisciction has exceeded expectations, while Manitoba had half of their expected development. I don't see this as a government that is in tune with what Manitobans are looking for. and I don't see Manitoba as leader in working with business and with industries that are prospering just a short distance away.

The girls knew they were going to be headed to Nationals after the Manitoba High School Rodeo Finals, which were held in Selkirk in early June.

"Thad a really good final in Manitoba, and that put me in the running for nationals, so at that moment, I was really excited, it was awesome—it didn't really kick in until Igot to Nationals, though," says Gage.

"The first day, we didn't realize how big this was going to be. There were arenas everywhere, and people and horses and trailers all over the place," says Gage.

"When we first got there, I was nervous because of how big it was—it was a lot to take in," adds Gabrielle.

Gage competed with her horse, Annie, who she says become the first hid, to remain a ready, who

Gage competed with her horse, Annie, who she says has been her faithful companion since day one.

"Annie was just a five-year-old horse, only fourteen hands tall, and she should not be running the times she is—she's a freak of nature," laughs Gage. "Most horses take three years to get riding barrels decently, and within six months of starting, Annie was competing with some of the top girls. She's definitely my main horse, we have a really good bond, though she can be a bit goofy. She's a drama queen—if she doesn't like something, she's oning the same thing she's oning the same thing she's so give. a reany good bond, mough she can be a bit goory. She's a drama queen—if she doesn't like something, she's going to let you know. She surprised us, because she can be such a drama queen, but she did awesome at Nationals." Gabrielle was riding her second horse, Feather. "She's a sweet horse, she does anything I ask for. When

I started riding with her, we really connected, and she's been great so far," says Gabrielle.

Both Gage and Gabrielle say that the high level of competition in the United States overwhelmed them.

petition in the United States overwhelmed them.

"They were definitely at a different level than we are. They compete at a way higher level. There were lots of pro rodeo horses, and kids whose families are all pro rodeo people," says Gage. "You realize how hard they must work to get where they are—we work hard at it, too. But, to get that good, they must work really hard at it. You push yourself way harder when you are down there, competing against them, you realize you could compete higher than you do."

Gage says seeing the high level of competition at Nationals has encouraged her to push herself.
"Probably, now that I've seen that, I'll probably be pushing myself more," she says.

Gabrielle entered the rodeo queen competition, and saw a whole different side of the high competition rodeo

saw a whole different side of the high competition rodeo culture in the United States.

"Some of the Rodeo associations in the States have a rodeo queen contest every weekend," she explains.
"There are girls there with makeup artists and hair art-

ists, and some girls have been doing this for ten years . . The hair and makeup people were at all the events with

the girls, touching up their hair when they needed it."

The rodeo queen pageant involves a speech, modelling, a test and interview, and a horsemanship show.

"My speech was about bullfighters, and how they protect the cowboys, and that they're a hero of the rodeo," says Gabrielle. "It think I did pretty well given that this is my first go at it."

Gabrielle didn't make the top 20 in the rodeo queen competition, but the core project.

competition, but she says going to Nationals was never

about winning.

"I went to nationals to have fun, I really didn't care about being the best or anything. I just wanted to have a good time and try my best," she says.

Gage agrees.
"At Nationals, I knew I wanted to compete at my highest, but I knew I wasn't there to win, so that took the nerves away. I wasn't there to do my best. I felt pretty confident going in there, just to do my own thing," she

Gage got 18.355 seconds in barrel racing, placing 81st out of 174 competitors. Gabrielle came in right behind her at 18.375 seconds. In cutting, Gage scored 131 points, placing 68th out of 98. In Pole bending, again, Gage and Gabrielle scored close, Gage at 22.972 seconds, and Gabrielle at 22.813 seconds, placing in the 103rd and 104th positions out of 163 competitors.

Both Gage and Gabrielle say the highlight of Nationals was meeting all the competitors from around the States and Canada.

"The highlight was probably to meet all the different

"The highlight was probably to meet all the different people from everywhere, and to learn all the things they do differently in the different states. It was cool to meet a

do differently in the different states. It was cool to meet a lot of different people, "Gabrielle says.

"At Nationals, people ask where you're from, and you say Manitoba, and none of them even knew where Manitoba was, or that it was in Canada," says Cage.
"But I loved meeting all the different people and learning about them."

The rodeo action didn't stop after Nationals. Immediately after the events in Rock Springs, Gage and Gabrielle headed to Nanton, Alberta, for the Canadian High School Rodeo Association Finals.

"Canadian finals felt like such a big deal last year for me because I didn't go to nationals last year, but this year, it feels like a little local rodeo after Rock Springs," says Gage.

Provincial High School Rodeo Associations send their top six competitors in each event to Canadian Finals.

Gage says there is a bit more pressure to perform well at Canadians because the level of competition is different

than it is in the United States.

"I am hoping to be in the top 15 here, that would be wonderful," she says.

am noping to be in the top 15 nere, that would be wonderful," she says.

Gabrielle says she's not feeling very nervous.

"I'm just here, at Canadian Finals, to have a good time, and that's how I do most of my rodeos, I am not a very competitive person when I ride. I want to enjoy it," she says. "Rodeo is filled with great people, that's why I stay in it. They are always friendly, and help you out no matter what you need help with."

Gage says that having Gabrielle by her side through Nationals and Canadian Finals has been great.
"It's nice to have someone I know with me all the time. We're traveling together, so if I'm lost, she's lost—I'm not by myself," says Gage. "We're sometimes in competition with each other, since we both do barrels and poles, but we are always happy for whoever does good."

After Canadians, the girls are headed home to St-Lazare. They say the experience has been a once-in-a-lifetime event.

"It's been a great opportunity to do this, and I think if anyone gets a chance to even go see Nationals, they should head down and check it out," says Gage.



itoba legislature, he was the critic for Conservation and water Stewardship. During this time, he travelled extensively Manitoba to meet with stakeholders and to listen to their concerns. It was in this role that he heard a loud and clear message: a long term strategy is needed to mitigate against

the constant flooding prob-lems that our region is fac-ing year after year.

"The destruction caused by this year's flooding has caused millions of dollars in damage and many resi-dents have been displaced. We might not yet know the final bill for damage, but we know it won't be good," said Maguire. "I am not here to direct blame at one level of government or another. Pointing fingers doesn't solve problems. I am here today to talk about finding solutions to our

problems."

"This is the type of situation that needs to have some permanent flood control processes put in place. Whether it's diversion or retention, those are the issues that an Assiniboine River Basin Commission can talk about, with all the players and the industry involved," Maguire said in

an interview on Thursday.

"It's very very costly to continue to solve the prob-lem after the fact, when each of these floods comes up. It certainly would be more beneficial to have permanent structures or at least plans in place to help manage some of this water."
"What this Commission

would do is bring all the players together, that's the first thing," said Maguire. "That would be a body then that would look at pulling all kinds of ideas together, from all of the municipalities being involved in the whole region, and have lo-cal organizations and oth-ers involved in this whole process.

"To the Governments of "To the Governments of Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and North Dakota: come to the table," continued Maguire. "Work together. We need to establish an Assiniboine River Basin Commission and we need our involvement to make your involvement to make it happen."

Debbie McMechan, a councillor with the rural municipality of Edward, says the Manitoba govern-ment needs to act, and fast. She says the government is well aware of the conflict

and the rising tensions. "When people are point-ing the finger at each other,

they're doing it out of des-peration," McMechan says. Manitoba government officials say they are work-

ing with farmers and area leaders from Manitoba and Saskatchewan to mitigate any future issues caused

by flooding.
They say they're currently investigating three or four complaints of illegal

rour complaints of lilegal trenching.

The Saskatchewan gov-ernment says it has 83 complaints and is currently investigating 15.

The Water Security

says there's an approval process in place before anyone can build a trench, but can't say if the ditches near the boundary now are legal or not.





- The panel will make specific recommendations on opportunities to:
 Enable Saskatchewan patients to participate in clinical trials that focus on improving the condition of patients and relieving symptoms:
- Improve the care experience of Sas-katchewan MS patients; and
- Better support MS research and education in Saskatchewan.

"We are pleased to be able to work along-side the government and other stakehold-ers who continue to show a commitment to

support MS research and improved patient care in the province," MS Society of Cana-da—Saskatchewan Division President Erin Kuan said. "Research offers people living with MS hope, and we are excited to be part of the discussion about how best to increase search capacity and access to care in Saskatchewan.

MS is a degenerative neurological disease that impairs or destroys the function of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord. About 3,700 Saskatchewan people are af-



Maguire also wrote to Premier Selinger, Pre-nier Wall, and Governor Dalrymple to urge them to work alongside the Prairie Improve-ment Network, to create an Assiniboine Ba-sin River Commission that would include the Qu'Appelle and Souris Rivers and related catchment areas. This initiative is being led by Dr. Al-

ment areas. This initiative is being led by Dr. Al-lan Preston, former Assistant Deputy Minister of Agriculture for Manitoba.

"We must pool our resources to protect our homes, our farms, our communities, and our way of live. For our children and grandchildren and for the millions of mouths that the food we produce feed on an annual basis. The people in this room cannot wait for another year of flood-ed fields and missed opportunities to pass," said Maguire. said Maguire.

"We need to make sure that we can put permanent structures or permanent management processes in place that can deal with eliminating and managing the flow of not just the Assiniboine River, but it would involve the Qu'Appelle and the Souris River Basins as well."

This group has already held a workshop this spring that brought various stakeholders to the table. They will also be holding an upcoming planning committee meeting in Minot and have scheduled a subsequent conference to be held in Regina.

Maguire asked that they look at the good

work being done by the Red River Basin Committee as an example of how these types of entities can be developed. The Red River Basin Commission held extensive consultations that brought communities together and are now taking a holistic approach to dealing with their watershed.

"I call on our leaders to make this initiative a priority of their Governments and I cannot a priority of their Governments and I cannot stress enough the need for all parties to be at the table. In my capacity as a Member of Parliament I will do all that I can to assist in getting this Commission started as the safety of our communities are too important for us not to take action now," concluded Maguire.

"Richardson, which is a Manitoba company, had been looking at a canola crushing plant in Brandon that went to Yorkton instead. Brandon had an opportunity to provide another marketing source for Canola producers, and Richardson was disappointed that province didn't even come to the table with anything."

into geology—but I don't think Selinger
has what it takes. I think Brad Wall has just blown him out of the water.

Doyle Piwniuk is the MLA for Arthur-Virden, which includes Elkhorn and McAuley. He said Western Manitoba sees some employment benefits from the PotashCorp Rocanville and Mosaic Esterhazy mines, and he would like to see a mine developed in Western Manitoba. "The Saskatchewan mines are good for

the local economy," he said. "There are people who live in Roblin, Russell, Vird-en, and even Brandon who commute to work at the mines. My brother lives at Dropmore and works at the Esterhazy

He said he will reserve judgement on the latest announcement until he sees

something solid, however.
"We've got our hopes up so many times and nothing ever materializes," he

says.
"It would be great for the local econit would be great for the local economy—it would be great for the whole region—but there has to be some kind of incentive and the government has to be willing to work with the private sector. The track record of the current government isn't good in dealing with business, and we're falling behind in mining. "We have so many natural resources in

our province, but we don't have a very good track record in developing them. "I'm hoping a potash mine does ma-terialize, because we have very solid oil and agriculture industries in this region, and to add mining to that would be good for our region and good for Manitoba, but the proof is in the pudding. 'There has to be some sort of solid busi-

ness plan, and the NDP government has put us at a disadvantage on the western side of the province where businesses compete with Saskatchewan businesses. "Our payroll taxes are higher, our indi-

vidual tax rates are higher, our personal exemptions are lower, and on this side of the province, competing with businesses in Saskatchewan we are at a disadvan-tage. The PST is also a big factor when ours is eight per cent and Saskatche-

Still, Piwniuk hopes there is interest

from mining companies in developing on the Manitoba side of the border.

"I grew up on this side of the province and there has always been talk of a potash mine, at Russell, then at McAuley, then just this side of St. Lazare. I hope it's more than just talk this time."

Over the past several years, mining companies including Agrium and BHP Billiton have spent milions of dollars drilling in Western Manitoba to explore the potash resource.

One are that is now part of the Manitoba Potash Corporation's block of land was held until recently by BHP Billiton, which completed a study on a potential

Agrium had a lease on another block

Agrium had a lease on another block of land for several years and went as far as negotiating a production lease with the province before walking away.

A 2013 Manitoba Mineral Resources report, quoting BHP Billiton, described a mine with two million tonnes of annual production as "technically feasible" while facing "significant technical and while facing "significant technical and economic challenges."


